Chairman Intro

Minutes of last zoom meeting screen shared and agreed.

Update on Contracted Out Works

Ramp and railings to container/shelter/podium.

Work commenced 8/7/2024. Chairman has asked for the railings to be fixed with bolts, Paul has spoken to Josh and this is ongoing. The cemented area has two finishes as a member walked through the wet cement and that area had to be brushed out. The concrete finish is very smooth, we may need to hire a concrete scarifier to roughen the surface before the winter frosts. The area also needs painting with yellow crosshatching.

Tree surgery Josh to complete topping of trees whilst on site as above.

<u>Safe permanent wheelchair access to crawler hill and fast buggy track</u>, to be included as part of carpark works which will commence in September.

Reminder for Water Extraction License Paid and submitted awaiting response.

<u>Catering Kitchen</u> Original heater to be collected by Matt to return. Matt has been emailed, still no response. Dave Burlingham is in the process of finding a new club electrician.

<u>Yacht competitions</u> Mike advised that George Younger has taken over the scoring system, currently ironing out the bugs, ongoing. Mike and George retrieved the yacht, work on buoy ongoing.

<u>Gardening</u> Paul advised that nine bags of compost had been purchased along with a new hand sprayer. Anne and Val have more plants to plant for the open weekend. Mike Brandi to be asked to only use weed killer on the Car Park and the perimeter roads. All other spraying to be completed by Val, Paul or Trevor. Thanks to Paul, John Jenkinson and Geoff Cundill for trimming the trees along the access roads.

<u>Do It For East Yorkshire (DIFEY)</u> Another possible grant source. Suggested projects Slip Road and Race podium. Details to be emailed to committee to read and discuss at next meeting. Defer until CIC outcome known.

Paul, Reports on site development and maintenance.

Buggy Track work has been completed, subject to ongoing maintenance. Photos screen shared. The AstroTurf has been effectively patch repaired using a green mastic type product, £100 requested to purchase more AIF. Alec Ward and Mark Dawnay are going to source and donate more AstroTurf to continue the repairs.


Crawler Hill maintenance completed, tided and weeded for the open weekend.

<u>The old red petrol push mower</u> is no longer used. Will be advertised on site at £10 to clear. No enquiries so far. Contact Paul or Trevor if you would like to purchase it. Ongoing.

<u>Martin Ranson is compiling a Club history from conception to date.</u> Ian advised that the VHS tape is with Tiger computers to update to DVD. Ian has the DVD and will pass on to Martin. Item to be deleted.

<u>lan and Paul monitor the lake levels</u> manually (the automatic lake levelling system has not worked for over twenty years).

Pictures screen shared. Site meeting between Ian, Paul, Alex Randall and Martin Ransom, new conduits to be put in and a Raspberry Pi model 3B to be purchased fitted at a cost of £120.

Detailed diagram provided and screen shared and discussed. Work to commence, ongoing.

<u>Site rodent problem</u> John Jenkinson continues to bait traps every three weeks. Traps to be placed out of sight for the open weekend.

<u>Fire Buckets</u> The additional Metal fire buckets with lids have been purchased and are on site, one for Truck Track/Railway, one for the Fast buggy Track and two for the Crawler Hill. The owner Rodney Hill expressed his gratitude for the committees' foresight as the sand saved his vehicle.

<u>Boat and trailer that have been left on site since last July</u>. The owner was emailed and had until the end of July to remove the items. The boat has been removed. The trailer will be disposed of by the club.

Rob Daniels set of keys for the pump house and pantry for cleaning and maintenance, Ian has been unable to source blanks, John Jenkinson has sourced and supplied, item to be deleted.

<u>Paul and Alex Randall spent a full day putting the tyres back around the lake</u>. The banks are eroding and the pavers that protected them are crumbling and failing. Paul prepared diagrams showing the issue, how pavers had been used to halt the problem and showing what probably needed doing in the future. Thanks to Sarah for sourcing the pavers.
