UPDATE ON SITE WORK

Lower Car Park -Safe permanent wheelchair access to crawler hill and fast buggy track.

- Previously agreed to purchase another 20T of planing's a budget of £500.
 Paul spoke to Matthew who informed him that its not the right weather to get the planings, he will get back to Paul when they are available.
 The conifer work would have to be completed before they could be delivered to the top car park.
 A sheet of planadow will be cut in balf
- 3rd table on bottom car park the timber is on onsite. A sheet of plywood will be cut in half to create a new tabletop. The old tops can be taken to bits and disposed of.
- Ian purchased a 'plastic' bench for the buggy track.
 A couple of members put it together for people to comment on.
 They can be secured to the ground and it passed the Sarahs bum test.
 Unfortunately, they are out of stock, we require 5 new ones in total, so we will have to purchase them from the next price bracket (£80 to £100)
 A budget of £450 was agreed.

Concrete Path Repairs


- Matthew has informed Paul, due to his current work he will not be able to complete any building works onsite as he has given up that side of his work and selling his vehicles.
- Josh came to site on Sunday 2nd March to discuss providing us with a quote.
- It was agreed that the path works are to be completed before repairs to the veranda are to be done before the site gets very busy.
- The quote for concreting between the yachting container and canteen cabin and underneath the bench area behind the canteen aswell as installing 16 metal post boots for £1,605.

Tree cutting.

- Some of the conifers sides have been trimmed and the cuttings have been left on the ground.
- Farmer 2 did the sides he could do with the tractor and blade as his machine was too big for some areas.



- Farmer 2 wouldn't cut the tops due to potential damage of the timber falling and damaging the tractor.
- Farmer 1 attended site with a flail and did some areas he could reach.
- Cost of farmers work £1,500.
- Whilst Josh was onsite he took the diagram with areas marked.



Works to be completed:

- A Tidy up raggy tops.
- B Trim sides back by at least 1ft, possibly more if sufficient green is remaining. Lower tops to match existing.
- C Lower tops to 17ft.
- D Tiddy up raggy tops and trim any sides that the flail couldn't access.
- E Trim sides and tops.
- F Tidy up raggy tops.
- G Lower tops to 17ft.
- H Trim crawler side.
- I Cut and slope trees from G to C.
- All works to be done by a cherry picker.
- All debris is to be taken away in a RORO skip.
- All work from Josh £5,370
- Farmer 1 states that we may not have to cut them again until late 2026/early 2027.
- A roller maybe required to flatten out the grass where the machines have been.

• Repairs are to be done when the pathwork has been completed.


Old Trailer.
